Check medications, foods, and other records before leaving home.
 On arrival, please remain in your vehicle and check in on your phone.

 Recommended procedures may not be completed during the visit if your pet is too anxious or fearful.

Services

Veterinary Exam: \$84

Exam + 3 Core Vaccines: \$175 for dogs, \$180 for cats

Parasite Prevention: Recommended for all dogs & cats all year. Save when bundling prevention purchases with an Annual Exam & Vaccines.

During each wellness exam, it is our goal to review the following areas of preventative care and make an individualized plan for your pet.

Dental Health

Bacteria in the mouth are a daily source of bad odor, gum inflammation, and brown tartar. Infection that spreads below the gum line can cause pain and organ damage. Pets should get daily dental care at home along with regular cleanings in the clinic to minimize their risk of pain and disease.

Behavior

It is common for pets to experience stress or anxiety in unfamiliar situations. We will stop any physical exam or procedure if a pet is showing elevated signs of fear, anxiety or stress, and develop a plan for addressing your pet's behavioral and physical health. Together we can make veterinary visits and other situations more comfortable and enjoyable for your pet.

Parasite Prevention

Heartworms cause lung damage and heart failure in dogs and cats. Intestinal parasites can cause diarrhea, weight loss, and anemia in pets as well as skin disease and organ damage in people. Ectoparasites including fleas, ticks, and mites cause skin irritation and transmit blood-borne infections to pets and people. Broad-spectrum parasite prevention is recommended for all pets all year.



Lab Tests

Blood and urine tests are an important part of the yearly wellness exam to screen for signs of liver disease, kidney disease, diabetes, dehydration, anemia, and infection. Over time, individual trends in lab results can help us identify signs of aging and illness earlier when more treatment options are available.

Nutrition

More than half of all dogs and cats in the US are overweight or obese. Inflammation from fat increases a pet's risk of developing arthritis, high blood pressure, diabetes, kidney disease, cancer, and other diseases. Dogs at a healthy weight can live up to 2 years longer than overweight dogs. Our goal is to extend your pet's life with a targeted nutrition plan.

Vaccines

Vaccines support a faster, stronger immune response when your pet is exposed to certain viruses and bacteria. Vaccination decreases the risk of your pet developing clinical symptoms when exposed to an infection, and can be life-saving. We will customize your pet's vaccination recommendations based on age and lifestyle factors.
